Working for the residents of Solna

Solna should be a vibrant city with a dynamic outlook. A place where it is easy to enter the labour market, start a family or retire. Whatever stage of life you're at and wherever you're headed, Solna should be a safe city to live in. Work and employment should be encouraged through low tax for workers and support for job seekers.

Solna is Sweden's top municipality for integration and has low reliance on benefits. We will make sure that all Solna's residents can do their best and play an integrated role in society. This is made possible by a good business climate that creates more jobs. To achieve this, it is necessary for everyone to do their best to learn Swedish and find employment.

In Solna, pleasant urban districts are emerging and replacing industrial areas and abandoned office premises. This helps preserve our green spaces. We welcome growth and development, while at the same time safeguarding sustainability and Solna's special character and unique natural values.

Safety package for Solna

Eliminating unsafe places

When the City of Solna cooperates with the police, property owners and associations in an urban district, it brings good results in the form of increased police presence, more lighting in public spaces and improved safety. We want to achieve this in more places in Solna.

More mobile security cameras


If crime repeatedly occurs in a neighbourhood, it needs to be possible to install temporary cameras. This has already been tried, with favourable results. We want to make it possible for more security cameras to be installed where and when needed.

Combatting drug dealing

We want to allocate SEK ten million to youth drug prevention efforts. We aim to strengthen parental responsibility and provide more support to families with young people at risk of involvement in drug offences. All crimes should be reported to the police, and minors who use narcotics should always be reported to the social services.

The way into society should always be shorter than the way out

Solna has Sweden's lowest reliance on benefits. Prioritising employment is the cornerstone of an integrated society where nobody is marginalised. That is why we started Jobbfabriken, which helps young people enter the labour market. We want to make this initiative permanent.

A safer Solna

You should be safe on your way home from a friend’s house, on public transport or on an evening walk. In a country with gender equality, it is not right that one in three women should be afraid to go out in the evening.

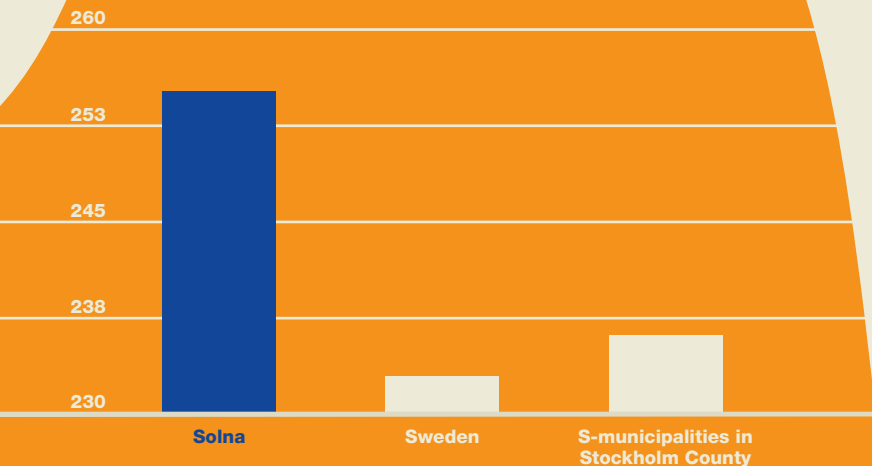
Unfortunately, danger and crime are on the rise in Sweden. Ten years ago, Sweden had one of the EU’s lowest rates of fatal shootings. Now Sweden has the highest rate. This trend must be broken.

This requires a new government. We need more police officers with greater powers. Punishments should become stricter. Preventative measures must be reinforced in Solna. More security cameras and more lighting should be installed in the city.

While there is no substitute for the work of the police in Solna, the Moderate Party is working hard to make Solna a safe place.

The Moderate Party in Solna wants to

- Invest in 100 percent qualified teachers and a maximum average of 25 students per class.
- Continue with efforts to provide all students in Solna with modern school premises.
- Establish the same rules of conduct in all schools and stop bullying and harassment.
- Raise school vouchers to improve education outcomes for students in Solna.
- Safeguard students' right to choose their school.

Education outcomes and rules of conduct in schools

Children and young people deserve a good start in life and equal opportunities for everyone. The merit ratings in school year 9 place Solna among the top ten municipalities in Sweden.

To improve the study environment and security in school, we want to introduce a target of 25 students per class. We aim to ensure that all teachers are appropriately qualified and dedicate their time to teaching. This requires school vouchers to be raised further.

We want to clearly define parents' responsibility for their children's schooling through expectation contracts. All schools should have the same rules of conduct, and students who bully should be moved.

Students in Solna should be given modern premises that provide a good study environment. Solid management of the city's finances has enabled us to step up the rate at which school premises are modernised.

These things are happening thanks to us



1. 4H at Överjärva farm

Opening a new 4H farm with animals, play and learning activities at Överjärva farm.

2. New sports ground

A new sports ground in Järvastaden with space for football and spontaneous sport activities.

3. New and renovated schools in Solna

A new state-of-the-art school to replace Tallbackaskolan and building of a new school in Järvastaden. Continued renovation of schools, with a particular boost for Bergshamraskolan.

4. New sheltered housing

We are building new sheltered housing at Bergshamra torg which will enable more elderly people to remain in their neighbourhood.

5. New public bath

A new public bath in Frösunda for exercise, recreation and swimming lessons.

6. Sports package

New sports centre in Vasalundshallen with twice the amount of space for indoor sports. Renovation of Skytteholms IP and Solnahallen.

7. New commuter train station

Build a new commuter train station at Huvudstabron and build a deck over the tracks.

8. New metro station exits


Open two new metro station exits, towards Pampas Marina and Solna strand.

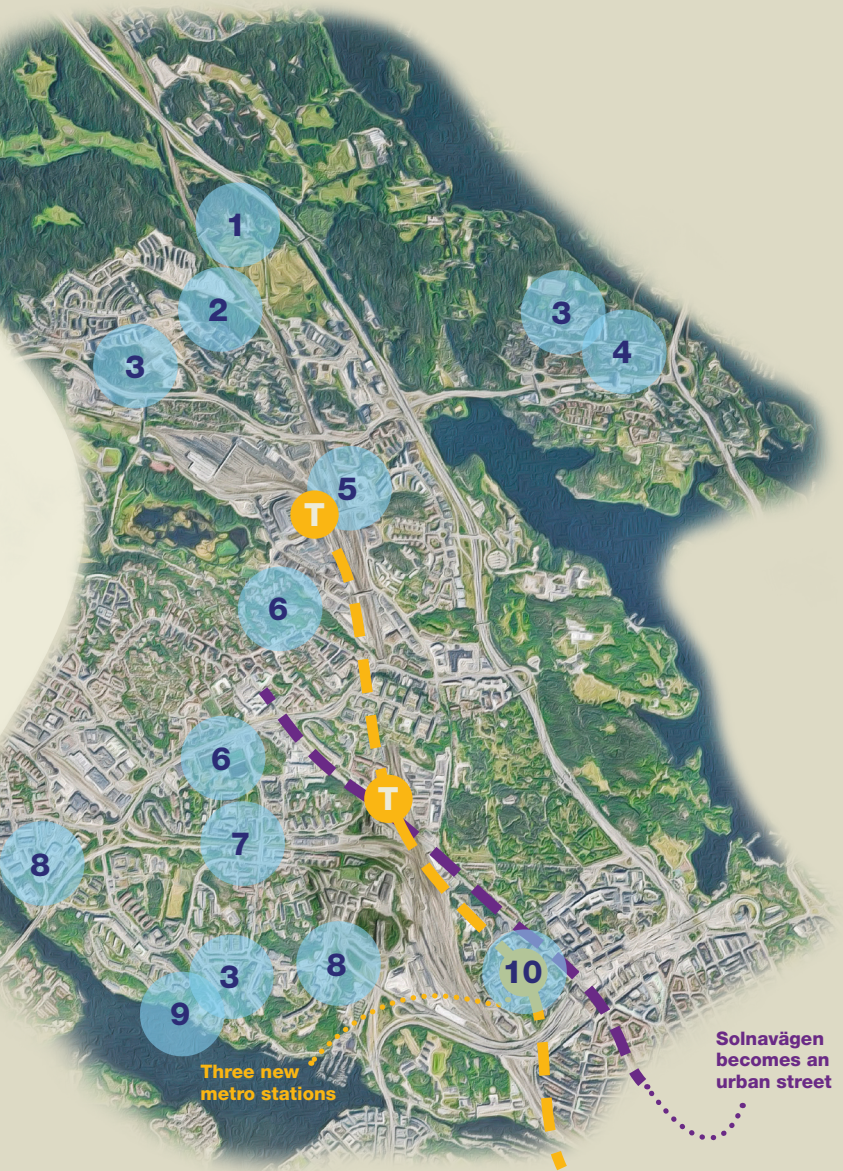
9. Upgraded waterfront promenade

Upgrade the waterfront promenade in Huvudsta. We want to install a new storm water pond for water treatment and expand the popular bathing area.

10. The new metro line

Develop services to and from Solna with the new yellow metro line.





A vibrant Solna

Solna should be a vibrant, safe, green city characterised by growth, proximity to green areas and an expanded public transport network.

Solna is the Swedish municipality that has converted the largest number of old commercial areas with industrial facilities, roads and railway tracks into pleasant urban districts. It is this type of transformation that we aim to prioritise when developing Solna. This helps preserve our green spaces.

We have made Solna the Swedish municipality with the best public transport. This is good environmental policy and simplifies the daily lives of Solna's residents. We know that all types of transport are needed in order for people's daily activities to function smoothly. Instead of obliging people not to use their cars, we should provide viable alternatives for those who want them. That is why we pushed for the government's expansion of the metro line to Solna.

In the next few years, Solna needs to focus on completing all the construction projects that are now emerging. Solna needs time to grow into its new identity.



The Moderate Party in Solna wants to

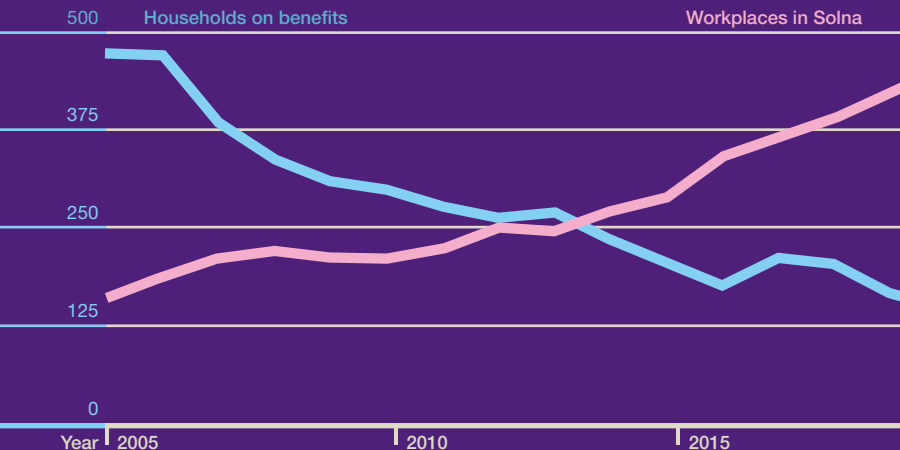
- Continue transforming old commercial areas into pleasant urban districts.

- Improve cleaning, install more lighting and plant more flowers and trees around the city.

*Jobs: SCB. Income support: Social Services, City of Solna

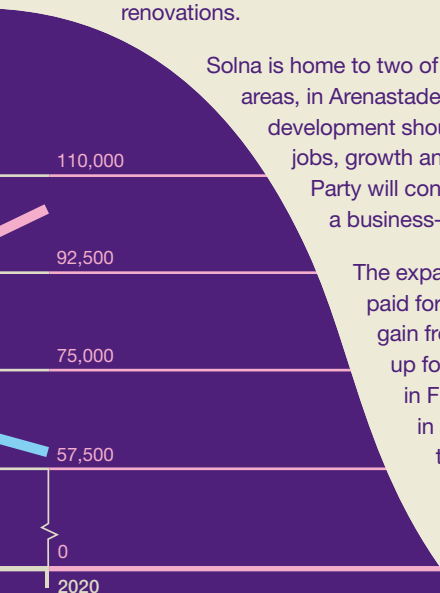
Well-managed finances

Solna's well-managed finances and low taxes mean that working pays off and more jobs are created. It is better to have many people paying low tax than few people paying high tax.

Our job is to manage tax revenues prudently and prioritise the municipality's core tasks. For example, we have succeeded in allocating more than SEK 500 million in extra funding for school renovations.

Solna is home to two of Sweden's most important growth areas, in Arenastaden and Hagastaden. Solna's future development should continue to be based on more jobs, growth and a dynamic outlook. The Moderate Party will continue to defend Solna's position as a business-friendly city.

The expansion of the metro line should be paid for by property owners, who stand to gain from it, so that taxpayers do not end up footing the bill. A new swimming pool in Frösunda and a new sports ground in Järvastaden will be partly funded in the same way.



Employment prioritised over benefits

The way into society should always be shorter than the way out. That's why Solna prioritises employment over benefits. Everyone who can work should work. People grow when they are able to support themselves and shape their own lives.

We help those most in need, and Jobbfabriken offers young people in Solna a fast route into employment. Through the Solna model, we help unemployed people find work in one of Solna's many businesses. Support should be given to those who really need it, which is why we have a zero tolerance approach to benefit fraud.

The best integration policy is based on employment. By providing early support for people to learn Swedish and learn a profession, we speed up their integration into society. Solna is highlighted as a European role model in the area of integration. We aim to be Sweden's leading municipality in this regard.

Emphasis on employment makes Solna one of the Swedish municipalities with the lowest degree of marginalisation. This is how we will build an integrated Solna.
